Give Back Nights


Give Back Nights are a partnership between your club and a restaurant.

These types of fundraisers take minimal effort, but you only receive a percentage of the funds. The percentage received differs depending on the restaurant. For example, Chipotle and Noodles & Co do 25%, BJ's and MOD Pizza do 20%. There are many local and national restaurants that participate in Give Back Nights.

When setting up the fundraiser, be sure that the check says your club's name and the UCCS campus address (1420 Austin Bluffs, UC 104, Colorado Springs, CO, 80918). Student Life will inform you when the check arrives and then it can be deposited into your club speedtype.

You can create an event on MLC to promote your Give Back Night! This is a great way to get the code out to all students and faculty/staff. Make sure to post it on your social media as

well!



Description

And if that wasn't a good reason to support our club with a restaurant you already eat at, you will have our love, gratitude, and appreciation.

Club Tabling

You are able to reserve a table through Event Services (see Club Events). One of the options to do for club tabling is to hold a fundraiser. There are many options for what to do at the table:

- Solicit donations: You can do this with cash or check. It is preferred that you do not use electronic payment methods (Paypal, Venom, etc) since those are attached to an individual's bank account, rather than the school or club.
- Sell items: You can sell individually pre-packaged items (ie- chips, candy, pop, Otter Pops, etc). You cannot sell other food that has not been procured through UCCS Catering. This means that you are *not* able to host a bake sale. Please keep in mind that all sales are subject to sales tax (8.5%), which will be taken off the top of the final fundraiser amount by the Financial Office
- Silent Auction: See next section

Silent Auctions

Silent auctions are a great way to make a lot of money, but they do require more work on the back end before hosting the event.

A silent auction is a fundraising event where items are displayed for bidding, and participants place their bids anonymously on bid sheets without the presence of an auctioneer. Participants can browse items at their own pace and place bids privately.

Silent auctions can be held on or off campus. They can be full events or they can be done at club tabling.

To hold a silent auction, please reach out to the Student Life Operations Professional *at least* 4 weeks before your event. You will then have 3 meetings with Student Life.

- First, to go over all the paperwork and documentation needed
- Second, to make sure all of the paperwork is filled out and completed properly
- Third, after the event has been held to finalize paperwork and do a deposit with the Bursar's Office to your club speedtype

Please keep in mind: all funds that are from selling items are subject to sales tax (8.5%), so be sure that you take that into account when selling. The sales tax will be taken off the top of the final fundraiser amount by the Financial Office.

Donations/ Sponsorships

Student clubs are allowed to pursue their own sponsorships and fundraising efforts. However, for academic-affiliated clubs, we strongly recommend checking in with your academic department before finalizing any external sponsorships to ensure there are no conflicts with department-level partnerships or sponsorship agreements.

Campus Department Partnerships

If you are an academic based another way to receive funding is to reach out to your department to see if they would like to partner or sponsor an event/ activity. This is also a great way to get faculty, staff, and other students from the department involved.

CU Storefront

A club can set up a CU Storefront page with Student Life. This is a new way for clubs to sell items or even to collect club dues. You can sell items directly to your friends, family, club members, etc. You are even able to set up a donation link.
