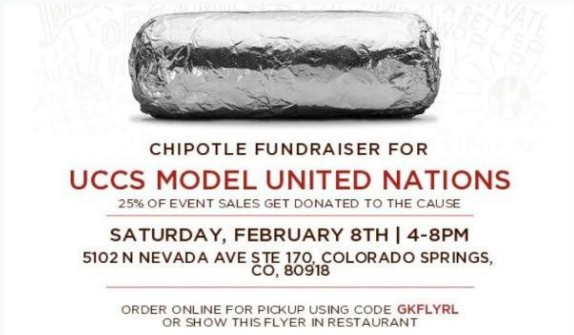
Give Back Nights

Give Back Nights, sometimes called “Profit Shares” are a partnership between your club/org and a restaurant.

These types of fundraisers take minimal effort, but you only receive a percentage of the funds. The percentage received differs depending on the restaurant. For example, Chipotle and Noodles & Co do 25%, BJ’s and MOD Pizza do 20%. There are many local and national restaurants that participate in Give Back Nights.

When setting up the fundraiser, be sure that the check says your club/org’s name and the UCCS campus address (1420 Austin Bluffs, UC 104, Colorado Springs, CO, 80918). Student Lifewill inform you when the check arrives and then it can be deposited into your club speedtype through a Club and Organization Deposit Request form (available on MLC).

You can create an event on MLC to promote your Give Back Night! This is a great way to get the code/coupon out to all students and faculty/staff. Make sure to post it on your social media as well.

Description

Club/Org Tabling

You can reserve a table through Event Services (see Club Events) for the purpose of raising money. Note that fundraising tables will have an Event Services reservation cost (typically \$10/day). There are many options for what to do at the table:

- Solicit donations: You can do this with cash or check. Clubs and Orgs (with exception to social fraternities and sororities) are prohibited from using third-party payment collection applications such as Venmo, Paypal, or CashApp, since these applications are often attached to off-campus bank accounts.
- Sell items: You can sell individually pre-packaged items (chips, candy, pop, Otter Pops, etc.). You cannot sell other food that has not been procured through UCCS Catering. This means that you cannot host a bake sale. Please keep in mind that all sales are subject to sales tax (8.5%), which will be taken off the top of the final fundraiser amount by the University finance team.

Silent Auctions

Silent auctions are a great way to make a lot of money, but they do require more work on the back end before hosting the event.

A silent auction is a fundraising event where items are displayed for bidding, and participants place their bids anonymously on bid sheets without the presence of an auctioneer. Participants can browse items at their own pace and place bids privately.

Silent auctions can be held on or off campus. They can be full “events”, or they can be done at a tabling.

To hold a silent auction, please reach out to the Student Life & Leadership at least 4 weeks before your event. You will then have 3 meetings with Student Life & Leadership.

- First, to go over all the paperwork and documentation needed
- Second, to make sure all the paperwork is filled out and completed properly
- Third, after the event has been held to finalize paperwork and do a deposit with the Bursar’s Office to your club/org speedtype

Please keep in mind: all funds that are from selling items are subject to sales tax (8.5%). The sales tax will be taken from the final fundraiser amount by the University finance team.

Donations/ Sponsorships

Student clubs and organizations are allowed to pursue their own sponsorships and fundraising efforts. However, for academic-affiliated clubs/orgs, we strongly recommend checking in with your academic department before finalizing any external sponsorships to ensure there are no conflicts with department-level partnerships or sponsorship agreements.

Campus Department Partnerships

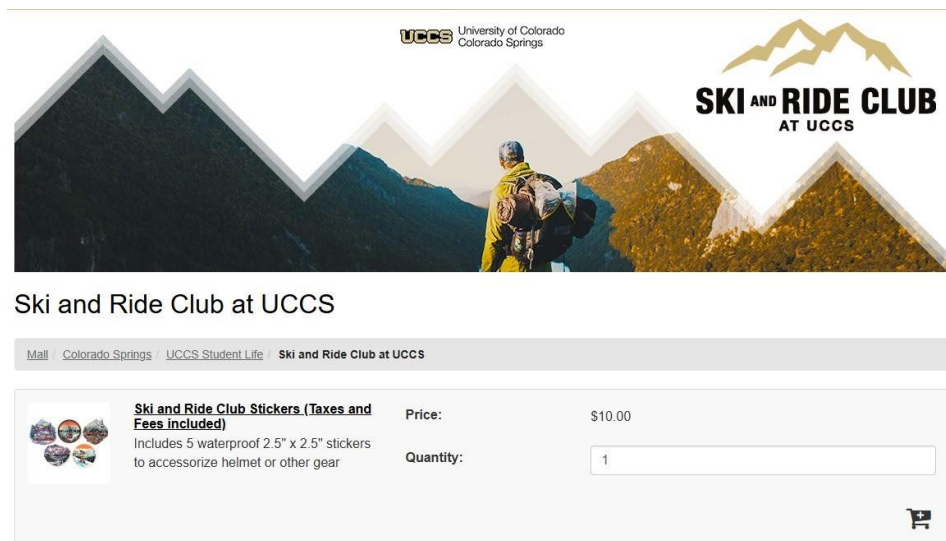

Clubs/orgs can set up a CU Storefront page with Student Life & Leadership. This is a new way for clubs to sell items or even to collect club dues. You can sell items directly to your friends, family, club members, etc. You are even able to set up a donation link.
